

CARE's vision of a world of hope, tolerance and social justice, where poverty has been overcome and all people can live in dignity and security, is becoming increasingly difficult to achieve.

Climate change is a risk multiplier. It is intensifying and increasing the number, and severity, of humanitarian crises across the world, and reversing important economic and social development gains. The world's poorest and most vulnerable, who are least responsible for causing climate change, continue to bear the brunt of its impacts. This is an extreme global injustice.

The UN climate talks in Bonn, COP23, are an opportunity to catalyse action. Countries must demonstrate to the world that there will be no back-tracking of the Paris Agreement: that the world is committed to taking it serious and stepping up action. Parties must tackle the issue of climate justice and ensure adequate support for poorer countries and communities that are already experiencing the worst impact of climate change.

### AGRICULTURE

Promote and catalyze learning, action and support in agriculture by establishing a joint work program on Agriculture and Food Security



### GENDER

Endorse and implement a Gender Action Plan and integrate human rights and gender equality across the Paris Rulebook negotiations

### ADAPTATION

Scale-up gender equitable adaptation to boost the resilience of vulnerable women and girls and their communities



### LOSS & DAMAGE

Implement the Warsaw International Mechanism with a focus on raising international finance to support the poorest and most vulnerable
