Food and Nutrition Security & Climate Change Resilience



FY19 Impact Brief

In FY19, CARE helped over 32,985,000 people to increase their food security and resilience to climate change.

Our food and nutrition and climate change (FNS & CCR) portfolio **reached 20.3 million participants directly and 77.5 million indirectly** through 560 projects across 66 countries.

Our goal is to improve the food and nutrition security of 50 million people by 2050, and aggressively address the injustices in global food systems.

Integrated Gender Approach

CARE is committed to achieving gender equality and empowerment for women and girls through our humanitarian and development programming using the Gender Equality and Women's Voice approach. In FY19, almost half of all FNS CCR projects (49%) were reported as **Gender Sensitive**, and an additional 35% as **Gender Responsive** and **Gender Transformative** – 19% and 16% respectively.

FNS & CCR Impact by Indicator



Reduced food insecurity for 4,279,165 people - 50.8% women and girls - with 68 projects across 24 countries.



Contributed to over 1,191,258 children under 5 escaping stunting, increasing the food and nutrition security of over 2,635,000 people with 23 projects across 16 countries.



Increased abilities to build resilience to the effects of climate change and vulnerability for over 1,900,000 people with 58 projects across 23 countries.




Contributed to over 8,785,000 people accessing community savings groups, including influencing policy and practice on Financial Inclusion in Malawi and Tanzania enabling 1,304,563 people to participate in community savings groups.



A CARE USA-led advocacy coalition successfully **increased US Government funding for famine relief**, leading to 50.8 million people receiving humanitarian food and other assistance, beyond those supported directly by CARE programs.
